

Clarification on Dress Code

Subject: Clarification regarding alleged “circular” or verbal instructions on girls’ uniforms

It has come to our notice that certain social media posts claim that our school issued a written circular or email or verbal diktats to girls of Classes VIII to X and that is “anti-female” and targets girls’ uniforms. These claims are factually incorrect.

Clarification

1. No circular or email or verbal diktats on this subject has been issued by the school.
2. Class VIII and IX are yet to start after vacation.
3. Our Academic Coordinator who is a lady teacher briefly addressed our Class X girls regarding proper wearing of the prescribed school uniform as part of routine discipline. This was a short, verbal reminder about uniform standards only. There was no instruction, written or verbal, that discriminates against girls or treats them differently from boys.

In the current climate of public discussion around school dress codes, such interactions can be easily misunderstood when viewed out of context. However, our uniform rules are gender-neutral and apply equally to all students. Our focus is on neatness, safety and discipline, not on policing or shaming any student or any gender.

As an institution, we remain firmly committed to providing a safe, respectful learning environment to every child. We are a student-friendly School, with a history of 44 years. Our major asset is the good-will of our old students and their parents, who have experienced the congenial climate of the School.

We will continue to communicate expectations clearly to students and parents and will not be guided by misleading or incomplete information circulating on social media.
